Dear Parents and Children.

Due to the current changes to the COVID-19 restrictions and the cold season fast approaching making sense of the guidance is getting more complicated I would like to remind you of what to look out for if your child becomes unwell.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a new continuous cough
- a fever/high temperature (37.8C or greater)
- loss of/change in sense of smell or taste.

A new continuous cough is where you:

- have a new cough that's lasted for an hour
- have had 3 or more episodes of coughing in 24 hours
- are coughing more than usual.

A high temperature is feeling hot to the touch on your chest or back (you don't need to measure your temperature). You may feel warm, cold or shivery.

Some people will have more serious symptoms, including pneumonia or difficulty breathing, which might require admission to hospital.

If your child or anyone in your households display 1 or more of the above symptoms, then it is vital that the household self isolates and the school is immediately informed. A simple flow chart is attached to help support your decisions.

All absences must be reported to the school office by 9am.



VENTILATING CLASSROOMS.

Public Health England (PHE) advice for schools is that we keep the rooms well ventilated. This will assist with keeping the air flowing and not becoming stagnant and stuffy, thus reducing the risk of virus transmission. It is, however, getting noticeably colder as the weather turns. We are conscious that leaving windows and doors open will impact the temperature in the classrooms. If your child would like to wear additional layers underneath their school uniform we are happy with that at present. We still expect FULL school uniform to be worn over the top of any extra layers so that the children look neat and tidy. Acceptable additional layers are:

- White, Dark Grey, Navy Blue or Black Long sleeved top to be worn under White school t-shirt/shirt.
- Dark Grey, Navy Blue or Black Leggings to be worn under Trousers/shorts or Skirt
- P.E days P.E kit as usual additional layers are allowed and rain coat also required.

APPROPRIATE OUTDOOR CLOTHING.

As the weather starts to turn can you please ensure you child/ren bring a water resistant coat. Given the current pandemic and guidelines we are going to be outside as much as we possibly can.

Next Friday is the last day of term so we have decided to do a non school uniform day, children can come to school in clothes that make them feel `HAPPY`, Pease ensure this is also suitable for PE.

STREET TAG.

Miss T has created a team for our school on the street tag app for our school.

Street Tag - participants record the distance they walk, run, or cycle by collecting virtual tags with their smartphone at various locations, watching their total distance accumulate to climb up their District Schools leader board; steps are converted into points by syncing their steps into the Street Tag app. This is designed to encourage families to walk and cycle to school, to be physically active, to connect with green spaces, and is an opportunity to rediscover their local area as well as earning rewards for their school. READING RECORDS.

This term we won't be having a home school reading record to save on items being transferred between school and home. In school we will be keeping a regular record of who has read when. We would like you to continue to record your child's reading at home in an effort to win a book prize. Book prizes are given every 2 terms. We will be working towards the end of Christmas term. In order to achieve a book prize, children need to read 5 times a week for 10 weeks (not consecutively). Please can you record your child's reading on the attached worksheet. We would like this then sent to us weekly. This could either be via email as an attachment or the children can take a photo and upload to seesaw. This is so we can keep an eye on reading at home as well as in school. We're hoping to have a record number of reading prizes given out at Christmas so get reading!



Guidance on this issue is changing regularly but 'anyone with a "new or continuous" cough, high temperature or loss of taste and smell is now advised to get tested and self-isolate for Ten days.'
