Unfortunately, we will not be taking part in this year's Oxford half marathon due to insufficient numbers anyone who has already paid will receive a refund.




MACMILLAN COFFEE MORNING.

PREPARING FOR BREXIT.

Apologies for Brexit overload but we have been advised by the Department for Education to give parents and carers the following information:

Any parents who have children that are EU, EEA or Swiss citizens are required to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 2020. Http://www.gov.uk/settled-status-eucitizens-families

SCHOOL PLACES AFTER BREXIT.

Schools and local authorities cannot take into account nationality or immigration status when deciding which pupils to admit. There will be no change to this after Brexit. Once the future immigration system is introduced in 2021, EU, EEA and Swiss nationals will not be able to enter the UK for the sole purpose of attending a state-funded school. This will not prevent children who are entering the UK for another purpose, for example, as a dependent of a worker or a student, from being eligible for a school place.

The right of Irish nationals to access education will continue to be protected under the <u>Common Travel</u> <u>Area</u> arrangements. https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/common-travel-area-quidance
